#### **NOTICE WAIVED**

Before the meeting was called to order, it was confirmed that all PMC members had agreed (prior to or at the meeting) to waive the seven-day advance notice required for holding a PMC meeting.

## It was MOVED (Michelle LeClair) and SECONDED (Marg Friesen)

That the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan (MN-S) Provincial Métis Council (PMC) hereby waives the seven day advance notice required for holding a PMC meeting, as specified in Article 3.7 of the *Constitution of the Métis Nation -Saskatchewan*, for the purpose of holding an Emergency Meeting to address extraordinary and emergent matters.

**CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY (240417-01)** 

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

John Lagimodiere, Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:15 p.m.

#### 2. OPENING PRAYER

Elder Norman Fleury and Elder Louise Oelke provided Opening Prayers.

#### 3. ROLL CALL

A roll call was conducted, and it was confirmed that a quorum was present.

#### 4. RESOLUTION: Constitutional Reform

#### It was MOVED (Lisa McCallum) and SECONDED (Michelle LeClair)

**WHEREAS** the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan (MN-S) recognizes the distinctiveness of Métis identity, culture, values and language - inclusive of knowledge keepers, Elders, Youth and distinctive resources – which is incorporated into proposals and decisions of the Provincial Métis Council (PMC);

**WHEREAS** the MN-S has committed to work with citizens and communities on amendments to the *Constitution of the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan* (the "*Constitution*") to ensure it fully reflects the values and aspirations of Métis citizens and enables the full implementation and realization of self-government;

**WHEREAS** the MN-S undertook community consultations with citizens throughout the province in 2019, 2021, 2022, 2023 and in 2024 to solicit their views on constitutional reform and has incorporated this information into a substantial package of proposed constitutional amendments and legislation;

**WHEREAS** Métis citizens have consistently reaffirmed the need to incorporate Métis values and culture into the language and spirit of the *Constitution*; and

**WHEREAS** constitutional changes require thoughtful consideration by Métis citizens and by the officials elected to represent them and that these processes benefit from extensive consideration and consultation;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the PMC supports proceeding with constitutional amendments related to the following areas, in time for consideration at the Fall 2024 session of the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA):

- Addition of language to support self-government and an affirmation of Métis rights to the preamble of the *Constitution*;
- Election of provincial representatives for women and youth to be included in the provincial MN-S general election every four years;
- Provisions allowing for the creation of a Métis Judiciary;
- Changes to General Assembly provisions so eligibility for voting will be open to all MN-S citizens of voting age; and
- General clean-up (including but not limited to minor changes to grammar, consistency, and removal of 2007 election details); and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** other proposed constitutional amendments will be considered by the MNLA in 2025 or in subsequent sessions.

## 5. RESOLUTION: Bill C-53 and MN-S Treaty Direction

#### It was MOVED (Glen McCallum) and SECONDED (Michelle LeClair)

**WHEREAS** the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan (MN-S) recognizes the distinctiveness of Métis identity, culture, values and language – inclusive of knowledge keepers, Elders, Youth and distinctive resources – which is incorporated in proposals and decisions of the Provincial Métis Council (PMC);

**WHEREAS** the Métis Nation within Saskatchewan has an inherent right to self-determination, including self-government, recognized and affirmed in section 35 of the *Constitution Act, 1982* and in the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples;

WHEREAS the MN-S took historic steps towards realizing self-government through signing the Métis Government Recognition and Self-Government Agreement (2019) and the Self-Government Recognition and Implementation Agreement (2023) with Canada, recognizing Métis self-government and committing to the conclusion of a Treaty and the introduction of federal recognition legislation;

**WHEREAS** the history of the Métis Nation is marked by sacrifice, struggle, and bloodshed as it fought to assert and protect its self-government. The Metis Nation shares a history that encompasses the exercise of the inherent right to self-determination, including the right of self-government, over many generations;

**WHEREAS** the MN-S was joined with the Métis Nation of Alberta and Métis Nation of Ontario in *Bill C-53, An Act respecting the recognition of certain Métis governments in Alberta, Ontario and Saskatchewan, to give effect to treaties with those governments and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-53), introduced in Parliament by the Government of Canada on June 21, 2023;* 

**WHEREAS** *Bill C-53* was subject to extensive scrutiny by the Standing Committee on Indigenous and Northern Affairs, and has not yet received third reading in the House of Commons;

**WHEREAS** outstanding issues with Métis governments other than the MN-S have hindered the passage of *Bill C-53* and recent legal developments have further diminished the viability of *Bill C-53*, and by extension the federal recognition of MN-S self-government;

**WHEREAS** realizing the inherent right of self-government is a core purpose of the MN-S government and of primary importance to the existence and well-being of the Métis Nation within Saskatchewan, and the MN-S has acted with the urgency and diligence demanded by the importance of this objective and the rare and singular nature of the opportunity at hand;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the PMC directs the MN-S to immediately withdraw from Bill C-53; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** the PMC directs that the MN-S shall take every measure necessary to:

- Conclude the negotiation of a government-to-government treaty with Canada; and
- Present the treaty to the PMC for approval and ratification at the November 2024 MNLA, to pave the way for the introduction of federal recognition legislation for the MN-S, in January 2025.
