### Public Statement from the Métis Nation–Saskatchewan government regarding MNBC withdrawal from MNC

The Métis Nation–Saskatchewan (MN–S) acknowledges the recent decision by the Métis Nation British Columbia (MNBC) to formally withdraw from the Métis National Council (MNC). We respect MNBC’s autonomy and the challenging considerations that led to this decision.

MN–S remains steadfast in our commitment to advancing Métis rights, self-determination, and governance within Saskatchewan and across the Homeland. While we continue to navigate the complexities of political and organizational dynamics within the Métis Nation, we are committed to protecting the inherent rights of our people and ensuring their voices are heard at all levels.

The Métis Nation’s strength has always been rooted in mutual respect and collaboration. MN–S remains open to dialogue and cooperative efforts with MNBC and other recognized Métis governments to address common priorities and challenges, ensuring that the interests of Métis citizens in our respective provinces remain at the forefront.

We will continue to uphold the principles of Métis governance and advocate for the well-being, prosperity, and cultural preservation of our Nation, now and in the future.
